Read Ezekiel 25:1-7.

1. What would you say is emphasized in Ezekiel 25:1-3, the introduction to the first of a series of prophecies against foreign nations?

2. What stands out to you as the main sin for which the nation of Ammon will receive judgment?

3. What is the judgment that God says is coming on them?

4. What is the ultimate purpose in God's plan regarding the nation of Ammon according to 25:7? Does this raise questions in your mind?

Read Ezekiel 25:8-17

5. What similarities and what differences do you see regarding the judgments on these nations in comparison with the judgment pronounced against Ammon and against Israel?

6. What good would these prophecies do since Ezekiel is in exile in Babylon when they are spoken/written and these nations are hundreds of miles away and are pagan nations? Would they ever even hear or read these prophecies about them?
7. Does God express similar messages of judgment to pagan nations today? What is the point of these chapters for us today?

Ezekiel 28:1-19

8. What is Tyre's consuming sin (28:1-10)? How may this sin become a problem for us today?
9. What words and phrases in Ezekiel 28:11-19 seem to apply to a being greater than any earthly king? What words or phrases in this section seem to apply to an earthly king and not a supernatural being?
10. Read Ezekiel 28:25-26. How does this message to Israel fit in this section of prophecies against foreign nations? How does it help us understand one of the reasons this series of prophecies is in the book?
